


Description of Item

An extensive area of shrubland that is regenerating to native forest. The vegetation is mainly manuka scrub with species such as mamangi growing up through it. Otherwise it is regenerating broadleaved forest with species such as young taraire, tawa, kohekohe and karaka growing amongst kanuka. In some places there are wetland areas within the vegetation. Much of the vegetation is protected by covenant. Kereru (NZ pigeon) are present, they are considered to be declining nationally.
