

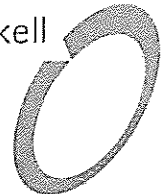

2. Further Submission to "Auckland Conservation Board" (Council Reference: 3574)


The Salvation Army New Zealand Trust Board ("The Army") wishes to make a further submission on the above submission.

3. The reason for the further submission is:

3.1 The submission raises a number of points. The reasons for, and the support or opposition to the submission points are set out below:

3574/21	10a.27	Support	Given the unique nature of the Island, the Army agree that it is appropriate to limit residential dwellings (up to a maximum of 10 – excluding caretaker residence) and associated residential accessory buildings, located within the areas identified as indicative house sites on figure 10a.5.
3574/22	10a.27	Support in part	The Army agree that the issue of how public access to areas of the Island is to be provided is a significant issue. The Army is concerned that the submission does not fully appreciate that because the Island is, and will continue to be, a privately owned Island, public access will be to suitable areas of the Island only rather than "right around" the Island as submitted.
3574/23	10a.27	Support in part	While the Army is not absolutely opposed to removal of the old and precarious pine trees from the Island with future re-planting of native trees only, the Army consider this to be an inappropriate issue for inclusion in the Proposed Plan.

3.2 The Army wishes to be heard in respect of this further submission. If others make similar further submissions, the Army will be prepared to consider presenting a joint case with them at any hearing.
