1. This is a further submission on the proposed 2006 Hauraki Gulf Islands Section (Auckland City District Plan). Proposed 2006 Hauraki Gulf Islands Section (HGIS) changes the focus of the previous plan to a more sustainable, low impact design orientation with consideration of the Island's various character areas. In particular, the changes in the Waiheke sections involve further protection of scheduled and archaeological sites, new land units introduced and in a general increased controls to move towards a more sustainable approach to development. HGIS seeks to maintain quality development and growth of the Islands whilst ensuring that this does not compromise promoting the sustainability and health of the Hauraki Gulf.
2. The submitter owns a property on Waiheke Island, that being 34 Tiri View Road, Palm Beach. At present the site has not been developed and is largely covered by vegetation and trees. Because of this the owners have a keen interest in the HGIS as they would like to have the potential to develop their site for residential uses in the future. Therefore they seek to ensure that the HGIS will allow them to proceed in the future without severe restrictions in terms of consents and development.
3. The specific parts of the HGIS this further submission relates to is:
  - a. Provisions: 7.3.2 and 7.14.2

4. The submitter seeks the following decisions from Auckland City Council:
  - a. Amend the plan change to allow for the changes noted in the further submission table (as discussed in Table 1, Appendix A).
  - b. That any further relief, including consequential amendments to the District Plan that may be necessary in the future, give effect to issues raised by the submitter.
5. The submitter does wish to be heard in support of their further submission.
6. If others make a similar submission the submitter would not be prepared to present a joint case with them at a hearing.
