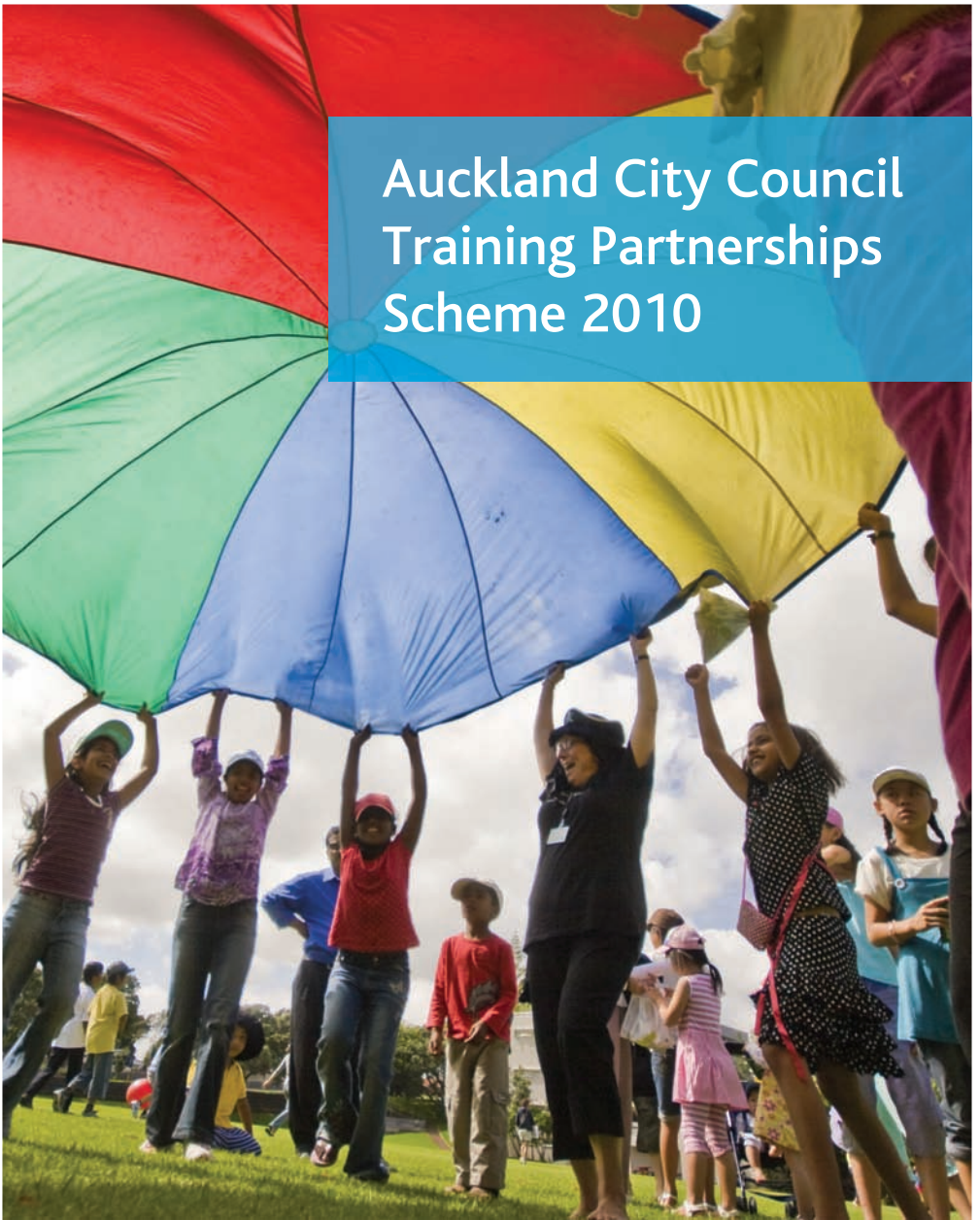


Auckland City Council Training Partnerships Scheme 2010





To learn is to open up endless potential both for the learner and those the learning is shared with.

The Community Services division of Auckland City Council plays a major role in helping develop strong and vibrant communities.

One of the ways it does this is through the management of a Training Partnerships scheme.

If you belong to a not-for-profit organisation, which provides services to the community, and are looking for training opportunities which will up-skill personnel in your organisation, then Training Partnerships could well be what you are looking for.

Why Training Partnerships?

Training Partnerships recognises the valuable contribution not-for-profit organisations and groups make towards the community. By linking not-for-profit organisations with a wide range of training programmes, Training Partnerships aims to assist in adding value to the work carried out by not-for-profit organisations.

What is Training Partnerships?

Training Partnerships allows not-for-profit organisations to participate **at considerably reduced cost**, in training programmes already conducted by training companies and organisations. It is intended that participants will apply and share their learning both with colleagues and, where applicable, to the wider community.

Is our organisation eligible?

Training Partnerships has been established to benefit and up-skill not-for-profit organisations who provide services to the community. Those with Trust or Incorporated Society status are eligible. Other groups are eligible at the discretion of the Training Partnerships co-ordinator. Schools are not eligible.

Who may participate from our organisation?

Anyone for whom the training applied for would benefit the organisation. This includes paid staff, managers, trustees, board or committee members and volunteers.

Who is providing the training?

Both governmental and commercial training providers. The main providers under the Training Partnerships scheme currently are:

ACE Computer Training
Employers and Manufacturers Association (EMA)
University of Auckland Business School

How long is the training?

Courses under Training Partnerships are mostly of one to two days duration.

What are the subject areas covered?

A wide range of subject areas are covered including:

- Budgeting
- Communication
- Computer
- Health & safety
- Leadership
- Legislation, facilitation and supervision
- OSH - Occupational Safety & Health
- Time Management
- Treaty issues

And much more...

Is the training free?

Training Partnerships is not free, but is offered to organisations at a considerably reduced cost.

How do we apply?

Each organisation may make **one** Training Partnership registration (this application may cover up to 15 courses for the year). Where an organisation has branches that operate independently, each branch may make an application.

Two Training Partnership places are offered per course. (Please note that these two places may not be offered to just one organisation).

How are people selected for Training Courses?

- Once your organisation's application form is received.
- Selection will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

How do we know if there is a course available for us?

Once you have registered with Auckland City Council to be part of the Training Partnership Scheme you will be given a registration code. Your registration code will be passed onto the Training Partnership providers, they will contact you with what training they are offering.

Once you have decided which training you would like to participate in, by contacting the training provider directly with your booking they will confirm your booking if places are available and request payment.
